Social Media Challenge:

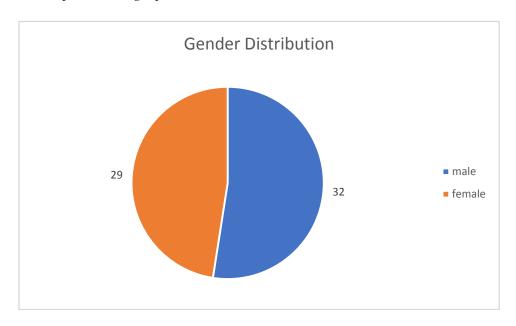
Feedback Analysis

To ensure a thorough understanding of participant perspectives on SMC innovex 2080, a structured feedback collection methodology was employed. Initially, a sample of 100 participants was randomly selected to provide their insights. Closed-ended questionnaires were distributed among the chosen individuals. Following the collection process, responses

from 61 participants were obtained. The received information was presented and organized in a tabular form to facilitate systematic analysis. The presentation of this feedback analysis serves as a crucial component in evaluating the success of SMC Innovex and identifying areas for improvement in the future.

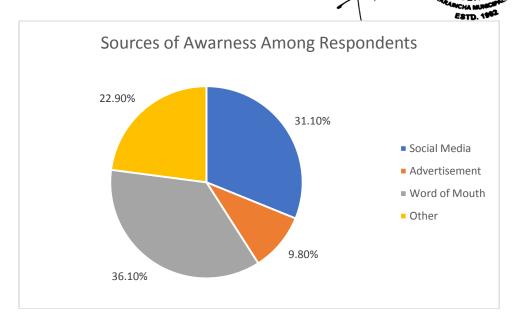

Participant Demographics: Gender Distribution



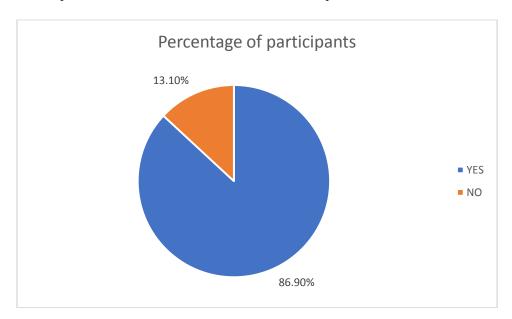
The data collected from respondents indicates a relatively balanced gender distribution among participants. Out of the 61 respondents, 32 identified as male, representing approximately 52.5% of the total sample, while 29 identified as female, constituting around 47.5% of the total sample.

In analyzing the sources of awareness for SMC Innovex 2080, it was found that 36.1% of participants primarily discovered the event through word of mouth, emphasizing the influential role of personal recommendations. Social media emerged as another prominent source, with 31.1% of respondents citing it as their main source of information.

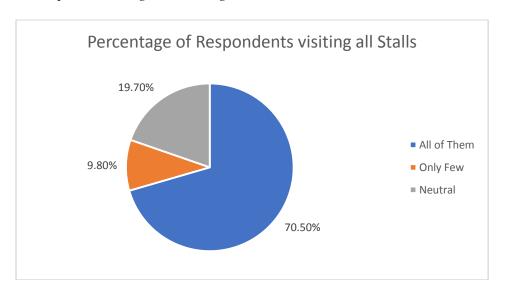
Figure 3 *Participant Interaction with Stallholders and Representatives*



The survey question aimed to measure participants' perception of their interaction with stallholders and representatives as engaging and helpful. The overwhelming majority of respondents, accounting for 86.9%, indicated a positive experience by responding "YES." This suggests that the interactions were effective, providing valuable information and assistance to attendees. Conversely, a minority of respondents, comprising 13.1%, responded "NO."

The survey question aimed to understand participants' engagement with the various programs offered at SMC Innovex. A majority of respondents, totaling 70.5%, indicated that they visited all the programs, reflecting a high level of involvement and interest in exploring the diverse offerings of the event.

Survey Results Analysis

The survey used a 5-point Likert scale to gather feedback from participants regarding the satisfaction level of various aspects of the SMC Innovex 2080 event. Participants were asked three key questions to assess their satisfaction levels. The survey results indicate positive sentiments towards SMC Innovex 2080. Regarding overall organization of the event, approximately 72.1% of respondents expressed satisfaction, meaning a well-received event structure. Additionally, a notable 72.1% of participants appreciated the variety of businesses and industries showcased, indicating a diverse and engaging expo experience. Similarly, satisfaction with the overall organization and layout was high, with 73.8% of respondents reporting contentment. These findings suggest effective event planning and execution, creating a favorable atmosphere for attendees to explore and engage with various exhibits.

Two additional questions were included in the survey, using a 5-point Likert scale with options ranging from Excellent to Poor. The first question aimed to assess participants' perceptions of visitor engagement at their stalls, while the second question focused on evaluating the overall academic environment of Sukuna Multiple Campus. The survey responses indicate that a substantial majority of participants, comprising 75.4%, rated the visitor engagement at their stalls as Excellent or Good, highlighting effective interaction and interest among visitors. Regarding the overall academic environment of Sukuna Multiple Campus, an overwhelming 80.3% of respondents rated it as Excellent or Good, reflecting a positive perception of the institution's educational atmosphere.

Participants were asked to indicate their likelihood of participating in similar nature of future events organized by the campus using a 5-point Likert scale, ranging from "Very Likely" to "Very Unlikely." The survey results reveal that a majority of respondents, constituting 84.4%, expressed positive intentions towards future participation, with 41% indicating they were "Very Likely" and 44.3% stating they were "Likely." This high level of willingness to engage in future events demonstrates a strong sense of satisfaction and interest among participants. Overall, these findings underscore the success of SMC Innovex 2080 and lay a positive foundation for future events.

Participant Feedback Analysis for Improving SMC Innovex

Participants were asked to provide feedback regarding SMC Innovex to identify areas for improvement and enhancement. The responses offer valuable insights into participants' perceptions and suggestions for enhancing SMC Innovex.

- i. Several respondents emphasized the importance of sanitation and the need for improved access to electricity.
- ii. Positive feedback was received regarding the overall management of the event, with participants expressing satisfaction with its organization.
- iii. There were collective concerns about the lack of fans and lack of chairs suggesting opportunities for enhancing attendee comfort.
- iv. Suggestions were made for implementing eco-friendly waste management practices to promote environmental sustainability.

- v. Participants noted the value of the knowledge gained from attending SMC Innovex, highlighting the educational content and experiences provided.
- vi. Some attendees suggested hosting more interactive panel discussions in open areas to avoid congestion issues within seminar halls.
- vii. Feedback also included observations about the need for broader outreach strategies to ensure the target audience is fully reached and engaged.

Overall, these insights provide valuable guidance for optimizing the future conduct of SMC Innovex.

Participant Suggestion for Future Events

Participants were asked to provide suggestions for potential programs they would like to see in the future of SMC Innovex or similar events. Their suggestions were enlisted as under.

- i. Several attendees expressed a desire for an increased variety of games in the gaming zone to enhance attendee engagement and entertainment.
- ii. Participants indicated interest in seeing more projects that focused on idea generation.
- iii. Suggestions were made for showcasing traditional technologies.
- iv. The idea of hosting a quiz competition was proposed, indicating an interest in interactive and intellectually stimulating activities.
- v. Some attendees suggested showcasing handmade innovations.
- vi. Interest was expressed in cultural-related stalls, indicating opportunities to showcase traditional crafts, performances, and heritage.
- vii. Some participants recommended inviting famous singers to perform.
- viii. Suggestions were made to involve big companies, potentially offering networking opportunities and access to industry expertise.
- ix. Participants also highlighted the importance of incorporating programs focused on career growth and development to cater to attendees' professional aspirations.

Budget and Expenditure Overview

This section provides the financial aspects of SMC Innovex 2080, illustrating how funds were distributed across various crucial elements of the event. The total expenditure for the event amounted to NPR 10,04,390, reflecting the meticulous planning and resource allocation required for its success.

Expenses encompassed essential components such as stall and booth setup, stage construction, payment to artists for music and entertainment, logistics, and marketing efforts. Additionally, provisions were made for catering, including food, snacks, tea, and water, ensuring the comfort of participants and attendees throughout the event. Furthermore, allocations were made for promotional materials such as banners, pamphlets, as well as tokens of appreciation, medals, and certificates of participation to recognize contributors and participants.

Another significant expense was the funding of science and ICT-related projects showcased by students. These projects required a substantial amount of funds to purchase components and materials necessary for their preparation. The investment in these projects not only provided students with valuable learning opportunities but also enriched the overall event experience by showcasing innovation and creativity within the academic community.

Other significant expenses included remuneration for entrepreneurs and industry experts who shared their insights and expertise during the event, as well as stationary costs and the provision of necessary equipment like music systems. Miscellaneous expenses were also accounted for, ensuring that all aspects of the event were adequately supported.

Outcomes and Impact

- iv. The event provided a platform for students to collaborate with local businesses, industry experts, and entrepreneurs, fostering valuable networking opportunities that can lead to future collaborations and career advancements.
- v. Numerous students actively participated by setting up food stalls, preparing and selling food items, as well as showcasing and selling commercial products, thereby gaining practical business knowledge and hands-on experience during SMC Innovex 2080.
- vi. The event highlighted the talent and ingenuity of students, particularly in the fields of science and information technology, showcasing their innovative projects and technological solutions to a wider audience.
